Axel Christensen is Chief Investment Strategist for Latin America for BlackRock. He is also a member of the Latin America Executive Committee.

Mr. Christensen's service with the firm dates back to 2009, including time with Barclays Global Investors (BGI), which merged with BlackRock in December, 2009. Prior to joining the firm, he was

Chief Executive Officer for Cruz del Sur Inversiones, the financial services unit of largest industrial group in Chile, from 2008 to 2009. From 2002 to 2007, he was Partner and Managing Director at Moneda Asset Management, the largest independent asset management firm in Chile. Mr. Christensen also was the Chief Investment Officer at AFP Cuprum, one of Chile's largest pension fund managers, from 1997 to 2002. Between 1992 and 1997, he also held positions at Citicorp, McKinsey and Banco de Santiago.

Mr. Christensen currently serves as a member of the Advisory Council on Capital Reform for Chile's Finance Ministry. He has also been a member of the Presidential Committee for Pension Reform in 2006, as well as an advisor to the World Bank and to the Finance Ministry and Securities regulator in Chile. He was nominated to the Global Young Leaders program of the World Economic Forum in 2008.

Mr. Patricio Sepúlveda

Chief Executive Officer Aeronex Cargo and President of The Chile – US Chamber of Commerce.



Patricio was born in Santiago, Chile, where he graduated as a Commercial Engineer from the Faculty of Economic and Administrative Sciences at the University of Chile, with a postgraduate degree in social and private investment cost benefit analysist. He held the position of CEO and Executive President for 10 years at LAN Airlines. Currently, he is the Founder and CEO of Aeronex Cargo. Additionally, Patricio is the President of the Chile - US Chamber of Commerce; their main objective is to serve as a bridge between the two countries to facilitate and increase the commercial exchange of goods, services, projects and investments. The chamber also sponsors cultural and sporting activities to allow a wider network of contacts to

ultimately generate business exchanges between Chile and the US, he serves on the boards and advisory boards of numerous companies. Since March 2020, he has been the President of FEBICHAM in the United States, the Federation of Binational Chambers of Commerce based in Miami, Florida.

Born and raised in Venezuela, Patricia Halfen Wexler left her home country after graduating with honors with a degree in Industrial Engineering from Simon Bolivar University. She began her business career with management consulting and investment banking experience across Latin America at BCG and DLI, respectively. After obtaining her MBA with High Distinction (Baker Scholar) from Harvard Business School, Patty joined The Walt Disney Company's Strategic Planning Group. She then joined Elevation Partners, a ~\$2 billion private equity fund focused on media and technology which invested in Facebook, Yelp and Forbes among many others. Thereafter, she ran global business development for Locaweb, the leading Brazilian web-hosting provider. After overseeing the McNamee family

office she co-founded Starlight Ventures, an early-stage investment fund where she led dozens of investments into impactful companies and raised tens of millions of dollars, delivering top quartile returns. She is the founder and General Partner of Avila VC, a Miamibased venture firm built to back the foundational companies of our resilient and thriving future. Investments to date span from distributed hydropower to grid optimization software, from 3D printing of biomaterials to long duration energy storage. She lives in Golden Beach with her husband, three children and pandemic puppy.

Andrea Irarrázaval is a distinguished social entrepreneur, the CEO and Founder of Carbon BioCapture LLC, based in Miami. Her company specializes in reducing CO2 emissions, as well as other industrial and atmospheric gases, to foster sustainable development and mitigate the impacts of climate change. Andrea has developed cutting-edge technology that microalgae to reduce industrial gas emissions. This process also produces a range of biological products such as food and bio-hydrogen. The technology holds patents in over 38 countries. Currently, she operates the only plants in the world that capture gases directly from a coalfired power plant in Ventanas, Chile, and from a cement plant in Cartagena de Indias, Colombia.

With over 29 years of experience advocating for and promoting female entrepreneurship globally, Andrea actively participates in numerous international forums that support gender equity and

sustainable development. She serves as the Chair of the Board of WEAmericas Foundation, which enhances education and formal training, internationalization, development, and financing for women in Latin America and the Caribbean. Additionally, she has developed initiatives to increase trade among women-led businesses within the 21 economies of APEC (WE APEC), both initiatives sponsored by the U.S. State Department. Chile. In 2018, she was named Woman of the Year in Energy by the Chilean Ministry of Energy. In 2019, she was selected as the only Latin American female energy leader at the GES in The Hague, Netherlands, by the Dutch government and the U.S. State Department. In 2021, she was appointed to the Board of CWEEL Chile ("Council of Women In Energy & Environmental Leadership") and honored as a "Woman of Excellence" by the World Economic Forum Chile.

Felipe joined CMPC in March 2019, mandated to create a new Corporate Innovation Office for the Company, at that time soon to turn 100 years old.
